Finally, a big thanks to all parents for standing by me and showing faith in what have certainly been challenging, difficult times for families and staff. We are well on the road to being a good school once more.

Chadsmead received 12 medals throughout the games resulting in 86 points to win the competition. They were 11 points clear of Fulfen Primary in second place.



Chadsmead have achieved an extremely prestigious sporting award:

### **The Gold School Games Award**

We have done this through the hard work, dedication and commitment of staff, children and parents.

How we have achieved our Gold award -

- We have held a school games sports day.
- We offer all pupils 2 hours of physical activity each week during school time.
- We display a notice board of all sporting activities for pupils.
- We have over 50% of KS2 pupils taking part in physical activities (69%).
- We have over 15% of inactive pupils taking part in extracurricular activities (18% - Intervention groups at lunch time).
- We offer gifted and talented sessions to pupils who excel (football team at lunch time and tournament training).
- We have provided the pupils with 9 level 1 competitions throughout this academic year (tournaments that have taken place in school).
- We have provided the pupils the opportunity to take part in 10 level 2 competitions throughout this academic year (archery, boccia, cricket, football, golf, netball, tag union, cross country, sports hall athletics and athletics).
- We have taken B teams to 3 of those 10 tournaments.
- We have taken a C team to 1 of those 10 tournaments.
- 20% of Key Stage 2 pupils have officiated, managed or assisted during a school games activity.
- The school utilises sports coaches to support school sport activity.
- We have 9 active links with the community, leisure centres or sport club providers.

Overall it has been a very successful year for Chadsmead in regards to sport.

We won a total of 4 tournaments - Cross Country, Tag- Rugby, Girls' Football and Summer Athletics. For three of them we represented the county and took part at level 3 football tournament at St. George's Park and the level 3 school games festival in Keele. This is where the Y3/4 Tag – Rugby team came 3rd against all the winners in Staffordshire.

All pupils have also been given the opportunity to try new sports during after school clubs and during PE as well as numerous experiences out of school such as the Y3/4 West Bromwich football tournament hosted at The Hawthorns.

Miss Stokes and Mr Haynes would like to thank all the staff who have helped with these efforts this year and the parents who have taken their child to and from tournaments and assisted the staff making this year a success. We would finally like to congratulate the pupils on what they have achieved this year. It has been a brilliant year for all involved and hopefully can be just as successful next year.

### Nursery
