Message from Mrs Grainger

I'd like to thank you all for your patience and understanding on Friday (2nd March) concerning the closure of the school. A decision to close school is only taken as a last resort and after conversations between myself, the Chair of Governors and the Caretaker. In reaching the decision many factors were considered, such as, insufficient staff able to get in, severe travel restrictions and conditions around the school being so severe that it presented a major danger. Also a big thank you to Mr Hodgkins, who had worked tirelessly in the previous days, to clear snow from around the site.

This week we have had parents evening. Attendance at parents evening was 84%. Many parents/carers that did not have a meeting this week, have arranged alternative times and very few parents failed to attend a booked appointment.

Thank you for completing the online safety questionnaire. The details of this, and that of the pupil survey will be available soon. The purpose of these are to establish the levels of support needed and areas of focus for the curriculum.

Year Group Updates

Nursery & Reception

This week Early Years have been continuing to learn about minibeasts by researching facts, writing about the life cycle of a caterpillar, painting our own minibeasts. looking the similarities at differences of minibeasts, taking pictures minibeasts using a camera, investigating objects which float and sink, investigating objects which are magnetic, making minibeasts homes and acting out the story 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' using finger puppets.

Year 1 & 2

This week in English the children have been imitating the story of Norman the Slug with the Silly Shell.

In Year 1 Maths the children have been solving missing number in addition and subtraction calculations.

In Year 2 the children have been learning about money and solving money problems. The children have also been investigating what the basic needs of animals are and their life cycles.

Year 3 & 4

Year 3 and Year 4 are currently working hard in their potions topic.

It was lovely to see children plotting graphs and analysing results of an experiment.

They have also shown real enthusiasm when being taught about the water cycle.

One fact that was amusing was how we may well be drinking the same water as that drunk by the dinosaurs!

Next week we will assess the children by giving them a number of 'quizzes' which they are used to doing and seem to find no problem!
