Our Teaching Assistants

Most parents understand that apart from our teachers there is another significant group of professionals who work regularly with our children; our 'teaching assistants' (TAs). Although they may not routinely appear at Parent's Evenings, write school reports or contact parents they are an essential element of our school.

The number of teaching assistants working in mainstream schools has increased dramatically in recent years. With the increased emphasis on children needing to develop sound literacy and numeracy skills early in their school lives, our teaching assistants have a vital role to play in not only supporting individuals and groups within a class, but also working on individualised programmes for those with specific difficulties or those who are more able.

Our most experienced teaching assistants also teach early morning boosters and cover whole classes when teachers have their weekly 'planning and preparation time'. In reality they are so good, familiar with the children and understand the work of the class, that we often prefer them to 'cover' sessions when staff are away.

A number of our teaching assistants have become teaching assistants after starting as volunteers and then undertaken training to gain teaching assistant qualifications. We have been very proud to appoint the very best of these volunteers to TA appointments in our schools.

Our teaching assistants are a proactive and highly professional group within our school. Gone are the days when they simply 'washed paint pots'. Our Teaching Assistants are regularly involved in evaluations of their performance and are observed by senior members of the teaching staff. They always go the extra mile for our pupils and offer extra-curricular opportunities, attend professional development sessions after school and regularly stay behind and support school activity well past their allocated time. We value them highly as a vital part of our team and without their amazing contributions our children would not make the fantastic progress we expect.

Year Group Updates

Nursery

This week we have been thinking about what seeds need to grow and be healthy, we have conducted a little experiment with cress and will find out the results next week.

We have a new garden centre role play area. Next week we will introduce price labels and a till allowing lots of opportunity for counting and number recognition.

Reception

This week we have been learning about lots of different real life heroes and how they help us. We have been fixing cars, been imaginative with the soldiers and the lifeguards, writing letters, doubling numbers, writing stories, weighing objects and exploring the shop.

Year 1

In Year 1 this week we have enjoyed learning more about plants and trees in our Topic time and counting in different multiples in maths. We have created new characters for our stories in our English work.

Year 2

In Year 2 we have continued our topic "The Scented Garden". The children have learnt the story of Jack and the Beanstalk and have written an improved version. We looked at our bean plants in science and written in our bean plant diaries. Our beans have started to grow roots! We also learnt about the life cycle of a sunflower and written all about it.

Year 3

This week the children have invented their own Super Vegetable stories set in the supermarket. These brave veggies have been fighting evil with their super vegetable powers! In maths we have looked at so much – multiples of 10, multiplying using the grid method and division by chunking. Chunking is a new method for us in Year 3 but the children have worked really hard to learn it.

Year 4

Year 4's Got Talent! This week, Year 4 have been working together during topic to start organising a Year 4 talent show! We have many different talents ranging from sporting activities to music and dance. We hope to carry out this competition in the last week of this half term. Also during topic, we have been learning about the science behind sound and how it is made and travels.

Year 5

It's been a shock to the system having to attend school for 5 whole days this week! We continue to tend to our seeds in our planters, whilst hoping for a few rainy days to help them germinate. We have completed some map work, locating which areas in Staffordshire have the most allotments. Our writing continues to improve with our innovation of an explanation about Wallace and Gromit's 'Snoozatron' machine.

Year 6

A big congratulations to Year 6. Their attitude to learning, enthusiasm to do their best and resilience in coping with a challenging week has been exemplary. We are very proud of them all, as I am sure you parents are too. A thank you to our parents also, for ensuring everyone was in school, well rested and appropriately resourced.
