Year Group Updates

Nursery & Reception

This week we have been making faces using loose parts, making playdough faces, programming bee-bots, using tweezers to pick up pom-poms, sorting objects by their initial sound, tracing letters using paint and cotton bud paintbrushes and practising our throwing using bean bags.

Year 1 & 2

Years 1 & 2 have been writing our own invented wishing tales this week. We have been working on subtraction in Maths and learning about the artist Carl Warner and creating our own 'foodscape' pictures. We have also investigated how we can manipulate bread dough to change it's shape in Science.

Year 3 & 4

Year 3 and 4 have been investigating how gas is produced in the body! A potent mixture of broccoli, curry and beans were left on a warm radiator to replicate the build up of gas inside the digestive system. We have also used disclosing tablets to examine the plaque on our teeth and enjoyed having purple tongues!
