We will be sad to see Mrs Parker retire and Miss Stokes leave for a promotion.


We also wish Miss Holwell and Mrs Gazey-French well as they end their fixed term contracts at Chadsmead and move to new teaching posts.

Myths and Legends

Year Group Updates

Nursery

This week the Nursery children had their first stay and play in Reception, it created lots of excitement and it's lovely to see the children ready for their next adventure. Our new topic is 'Out at Sea'. We read 'The Rainbow Fish' and have been drawing lots of different sea creatures. We also have a new pirate role play area.

Reception

This week we have been creating our own story about Nemo the clownfish. We started with some simple sentences and turned it into a story by adding in more detail. We have also been learning to retell our story using some actions.

Year 1

In Year 1 we have started to think about our new story 'The Good Dinosaur'. The children have measured chalk dinosaurs in the playground. We have also begun working on multiplication and division.

Competition Winners

Earlier in the year in Year 1 we had an author visit. During the session on 'Superheroes' the children designed superhero pictures. Two children were chosen as winners for their work which is currently being displayed for the duration of the festival at The Lichfield Garrick on the top floor of the community stage.

The winners are: Ellie (Cherry class) and Oscar (Apple class). Anyone is welcome to view the inspired artwork during the festival.

Year 2

Children in Year 2 have just completed their final scooter training and all of them have thoroughly enjoyed the experience.

In our topic lessons they have been learning about the 4 points of a compass and had great fun following directional instructions from their imaginary pirate ship. Some were so good that they have also used an 8 point compass. The children have also finished their treasure maps, making them look really old.

Year 3

This week we are all very excited to read the children's invented stories as Pandora will have journeyed to the Harpies' island, Medusa's lair or the Minotaur's labyrinth! The children have worked so hard inventing the story of Pandora's Box. In maths we have continued using column addition and revisited subtraction by counting up. Finally our Greek activity day is coming on Tuesday next week and we are all really looking forward to that!





Year 4

This week, Year 4 have been learning about different celebrations and festivals in America. We have learned all about Independence Day and held our very own party. All of the children looked fantastic! We wrote down different reasons we have to celebrate being us and Mandy in the kitchen even made us amazing American style cookies!

Year 5

The children returned to Netherstowe High School on Monday afternoon to present the lovely work they had done on an earlier visit. Parents had the opportunity to see the hard work and effort that had gone into a history and an art project. All of our children conducted themselves in a mature, confident manner and were eager to share their project experience with the audience. What great ambassadors for the school!
