Our New Pupils

'making sure our new pupils get the best possible start'

Strange as it might seem, at this time of year we are not only thinking of finishing the academic year, but are also involved in full scale preparations for next academic year!

Throughout our primary schools, all manner of 'induction activities' are currently taking place. For our new Reception children, we have already visited many of the 'settings' children will come from and also hosted 'open mornings' and 'parent's induction meetings' to explain how our schools work. Children are also welcome into school to visit the class and attend sessions such as 'story time'. These events are designed to ensure that parents and children not only feel part of the 'big family' but also understand how our schools work.

In September we will also conduct 'home visits' which again build that important link between home and school. During 'home visits' our new children get the chance to see their teacher in a familiar setting and also for parents to share any concerns or worries.

We also make sure that our Year 6 children are extremely well prepared for their next big step. Apart from regular visits to secondary schools throughout the year and meetings between teachers to talk about the children, we are also very grateful to colleagues from secondary schools who visit us to get to know them and answer any questions they might have. Our children also benefit from all manner of 'familiarisation sessions' at their new schools, which are arranged by academic departments.

'Induction' is however not limited to the start and end of each year. Because of the very large number of children that have joined us mid-year, we have excellent arrangements in place to ensure that new pupils feel comfortable starting their new school. A 'mid-year' starter is always given a 'School Shadow'; a role the children are proud to undertake. A 'Shadow' meets their new friend at the start of the school day, helps them find their coat peg, shows them about, play with them at lunchtime and generally looks after them in their first few weeks.

Parents tell us that children who join us feel safe, secure and settled and make excellent progress with us. We care a great deal about ALL of our children and will do our utmost to ensure they are well prepared, happy and confident.

School Uniform—We believe that children should wear uniform in school.

Girls:

- Grey 'school type' trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore dress
- White shirt/polo shirt (logo not required) or blue logo polo shirt
- Royal blue sweatshirt or V-necked cardigan (at least one with logo for trips, photos etc)
- Black school shoes (flat sole/low heels not trainers)
- Grey/White socks/tights
- Blue check only summer dresses

Boys:

- Grey 'school type' trousers or shorts
- White shirt/polo shirt (logo not required) or blue logo polo shirt
- Royal blue sweatshirt (at least one with logo for trips, photos etc)
- Black school shoes (flat sole/low heels not trainers)
- Grey/White socks

NB: Summer fashion shoes e.g. 'jelly beans', flip flops, open toed sandals, and canvas shoes etc are not permitted

PE Kit:

- Black shorts
- White or Blue Plain or Chadsmead Logo T-Shirt
- Black Pumps or Trainers.

EVERY item of uniform MUST be marked with the child's full name

- Jewellery must not be worn in school at any time. We prefer children NOT to wear earrings because of potential for accidents. However, small round 'ball like' silver/gold studs may be worn ONLY. These MUST be removed for PE.
- Extreme hair styles are not permitted. Only natural hair colours please.
