## Year Group Updates

### Nursery & Reception

This week Early Years have been enjoying Easter activities such as designing their own Easter egg, creating patterned eggs, Easter hunts, reading the Easter story, counting the number of chicks in the nests, Easter small world and making homes for the Easter chicks and rabbits.

### Year 1 & 2

### Year 3 & 4
