Free School Meals

Have your circumstances changed recently?

Have you recently checked if you are eligible for Free School meals?

Parents claiming some benefits can claim free school meals for any of their children who are registered at our school.

School meals are a good way to ensure that your child eats well at lunchtime and you can save yourself time and money.

Even if you don't want your children to have the meals, claiming them helps our school. The more eligible parents who claim meals, the more funding the school receives

You can claim free school meals for your children if you are in receipt of any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment and Support Allowance
- Eligible for Child Tax Credit **but not** Working Tax Credit and the household income (as used by HMRC to assess tax credits) is not more that £16,190.
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit (from 30th April 2005)
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- In receipt of the 4 week run on of working tax credit (this is where someone becomes unemployed or reduces their hours and so is no longer entitled to working tax credit but will continue to receive it for a further 4 weeks and is entitled to free meals during that time)
- Universal credit

Apply online at www.staffordshire.gov.uk/freeschoolmealsapplication.

You'll need to have your date of birth and national insurance number or national asylum support service number, along with your address and the children's details with you when you apply. You can apply for several children at a time on one application even if they are all at different schools. The local authority will check your information and give you an immediate answer and the chance to print a confirmation to provide to school to start taking meals as soon as possible.

All children in reception, year 1 or year 2 are automatically entitled to free school meals, EVEN IF YOU DON'T receive one of the qualifying benefits or tax credits and so don't have a valid claim registered with us. Every child with a registered FSM claim 'wins' school additional funding.

Year Group Updates

Nursery

Nursery have begun a topic on 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'.
