EHCNA / EHCP Pathway

Staff together with parents have already agreed that the child meets the **Code of Practice Criteria** for SEND and is on the school's SEND register.

The pupil is already supported through the schools SEND systems and procedures with termly reviews of their **Individual Plan for Support** of Assess, Plan, Do, Review cycles

A **graduated response** has taken place over time and support pathways have been amended and changed to meet the developing need of the pupil but no progress is being made and school is finding it challenging to meet need.

External professionals have observed and undertaken assessments relating to the pupil need and school have put in place any reasonable adjustment possible from the recommendations made.

School have referred the pupil to the **Lichfield and Burntwood SEND and Inclusion Hub** to discuss the pupil's next steps and gain any additional advice and support ideas from other SENCOs across the district

School have put in place recommendations made from the SEND and Inclusion Hub and reported back to the SEND and Inclusion Hub any changes that may have occurred so that further advice can be obtained.

Where SEND and Inclusion Hub SENCOs agree, an escalation to the **SEND and Inclusion Local Management Group** can be agreed with a view to request Enhanced Assess Plan Do Review support (EAPDR Support)

An **EAPDR pathway** may be agreed by the Local Management Group or further advice & support may be recommended through the SEDIS Model (Staffordshire Enhanced District Inclusion Support) may be recommended as an alternative support pathway.

(NB: EAPDR support can only be accessed if the EHCNA process is not underway already externally from the hub, otherwise the legal process of EHCNA / EHCP assessment has to run its course separately from the SEND and Inclusion Hub.
