Spelling Strategy / Spelling Mountain

Write the word to spell - bridge using a different colour for each letter string - **b r i d g e**

Look at the word, read it and sound it out loud letter by letter – **bridge / b r i d g e**

Make a mountain of the letters, starting at the top, adding a letter at a time - keep looking back at the original word to help you

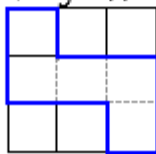
