



Message from Early Years

This week we have been continuing to read our new story 'Come on, Daisy!'. The children have made their own lost poster to help find Daisy. The children have been trying really hard to write some super sentences to describe Daisy.

In Maths Mastery this week we have been exploring numbers within 10. We have been finding out one more/ fewer than a number within 10, ordering numbers to 10 and looking at the most and fewest. The vocabulary which we have been using in our lessons is **fewer, less, most, fewest, decreasing, increasing, greatest, one greater, altogether and order.**

In the classroom, we have been completing lots of exciting activities such as painting a rainbow fish using celery, exploring different resources to make cakes, exploring capacity and weight, investigating the mini beasts, making shapes out of playdough, building CVC words, designing our own models and much more.

During the afternoons, we have been exploring floating and sinking. As a class, we predicted which objects would float or sink. We recorded this as a class and then carried out the investigation. The children record what happened to the objects and we discussed this as a class to see if our predictions were correct.
