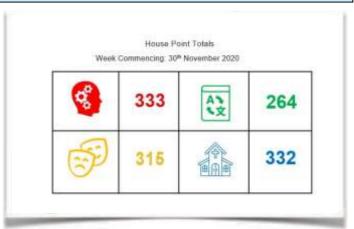


IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ALL PARENTS/CARERS FROM THE GOVERNMENT REGARDING THE CHRISTMAS PERIOD – NOTE CHADSMEAD IS OPEN AS NORMAL ON FRIDAY 18TH DECEMBER.

Where a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms more than 48 hours since being in school, that is after 3.30pm on Sunday 20th December, the school should not be contacted. Parents and carers should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.

For the first 6 days after teaching ends, that is Thursday December 24th, if a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school (that is becoming ill on the Friday evening, Saturday or Sunday up to 3.30pm) all schools have been asked to assist in identifying close contacts and advising self-isolation, as the individual may have been infectious whilst in school. Parents will do this by using the normal communication method of My Ed. Thank you for your continued support in sending this information to protect others.

PLEASE KEEP YOUR GUARD UP OVER THE COMING DAYS IN PREVENTING THE SPREAD OF THIS VIRUS. Please consider wearing a mask if you can, whilst walking into and leaving school. Keep your distance. DO NOT stand close together inside or outside the school.



TikTok Update Parental Controls with Family Pairing Feature (SWGfL)

TikTok is used by many teenagers and sometimes children younger than that 13 despite its terms and conditions. Using the new Family Pairing feature can allow parents to guide their child's TikTok experience in a safer way. Features include:

- Search: Decide what can be searched for. This includes content, users, hashtags, or sounds
- Screen Time Management: Sets how long your teen can spend on TikTok each day
- Discoverability: Decide on the account being private (you decide who can see their content) or public (anyone can search and view content)

Years 1 & 2

Initially these documents have been designed to support Staffordshire's DfE Wellbeing for Education Return Programme, are interactive maps that aim to show the whole CAHMS system and how and where support for children and young people can be found. You will find an interactive map for North Staffordshire and one for South Staffordshire via the weblink as there are subtle differences in the support and routes to access it across the two areas.

The maps demonstrate how self-help and low-level support can be accessed by children, young people and families. They then also show the way in which support can be accessed if emotional and mental health needs escalate on the second page that provides a useful list of contact numbers and written information.
