#### Years 1 & 2

Wow can you believe it is the end of week 3 already! Year 1 and Year 2 are settling even better and the new routines and organisation of our new classes is becoming more familiar.

We started our week off with a 'Wow' starter day to introduce our new theme, 'Muck, Mess and Mixtures'. During this day, we had a super time learning about melting. We investigated how long it would take for everyday foods to melt using our body heat. The chocolate melted very quickly! Then we made chocolate crispy cakes by melting chocolate in a microwave and mixing in the rice krispies. Our final job of the day was painting using ice cubes. It was great fun and we created abstract paintings using primary colours which mixed together to make secondary colours.

We have begun reading the story 'The Disgusting Sandwich' in English and will do lots of writing about it in the weeks to come. In maths, Year 2 are continuing to work on identifying the value of digits in a 2-digit number. Year 1 have been working on making numbers up to 10.

#### **REMINDER:**

PE IS NOW ON MONDAYS (bring PE kits in a bag) and THURSDAYS (instead of Tuesday) come to school in PE kits. Book bags need to come to school every day please.

#### Years 3 & 4

Years 3 & 4 have had a great week. We have now really got into the swing of things and are working very hard on our reading, writing and maths, as well as our theme lessons. The children are enjoying reading a classic piece of children's literature - Stig of the Dump by Clive King, which links nicely to 'Tribal Tales' our theme which is based on Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age.

#### **Home Learning:**

We have issued the children with logins for Rock Star times tables - please encourage them to use this highly effective app 4-5 times a week for 10 minutes. Also, the children bring spellings home each Friday for a test the following Friday. Please encourage them to learn these in a quiet space 4-5 times a week for 10 minutes. The children that do their home learning each week show a clear pattern of improvement and progress at a much faster rate than those that don't. This is especially true for reading at home.

Finally, children will be given a writing or maths homework each Thursday - in for the following Tuesday.

We appreciate it seems like a lot to do at home but once children are in a routine of spending a little but frequent period of time doing their homework it really does help them. Thanks for your support on this.

#### Years 5 & 6

Years 5 & 6 have this week started our new theme, 'Off with Her Head', we have looked at the Battle of Bosworth Field and Henry VII, where this fits on to a timeline and have used 4 and 6 figure grid references to locate key areas on a map.

In writing, we have been writing riddles, whilst in reading we have begun our new book 'Treason'. The Tudors is a fascinating and significant part of British History, the pupils have pleasingly been very inspired this week.

In maths we are all working on place value, ordering and comparing numbers and rounding.

Again, we would like to reiterate how pleased we are with the Years 5 & 6 pupils' attitude to learning.
