Attendance

Yesterday you were provided with a paper copy of our attendance policy. It can also be found on our website. I have alerted you to the changes in legislation throughout last academic year. Here is a reminder:

No holiday can be authorised. Head teachers may not grant leave of absence for a holiday. Any/all holidays COULD result in a fine being issued.

Head teachers may grant leave of absence for exceptional circumstances. Exceptional circumstances are "exceptional".

Unauthorised persistent absence of 10 school days in a period of 12 school weeks COULD result in a fine.

10 sessions of persistent late arrival – arriving after registers have closed COULD result in a fine. Registers close at 9.25am, any child arriving after this time is marked as 'U'.

If children arrive before registration has closed, they are marked "L" - present, but late.

IN ALL CIRCUMSTANCES WHERE YOU INTEND OR PLAN TO TAKE YOUR CHILD OUT OF SCHOOL, YOU HAVE A LEGAL DUTY TO LET US KNOW. In every instance, you are encouraged to GIVE AS MUCH DETAIL AS POSSIBLE WHERE NOTIFICATION OF ABSENCE OR EXCEPTIONAL CIRCUMSTANCES ARE BEING EXPLAINED.

The attendance policy outlines our internal procedure for dealing with persistent absence and lateness. Please be aware that you <u>will</u> be contacted regarding these issues. If you wish to discuss your own concerns regarding your child's attendance, please contact the school office to book an appointment with myself.

We continue to thank the very large majority of our parents who ensure that their children are in school, on time for each and every day establishing good habits and attitudes for future schools and the world of work and beyond. Thank you.


Year Group Updates	
Nursery & Reception	Years 3 & 4
We have had another super week getting to know the children. The children have built strong relationships with adults and their peers. We have been learning all about our family and the children have even made their own family tree. The children have painted their own portrait which will be displayed in the entrance of the Early Years Unit. In Literacy this week we have been reading the story 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea'. We created our own story map and even put actions to the pictures. We have written a list of different foods that the Tiger ate from the story. In Maths we have been sorting, matching, comparing and ordering different objects such as pom-poms, sorting bears, shapes, vehicles and jigsaws.	Year 3/4 are now really in the swing of the new term and working very hard. We enjoyed our visit to Beacon Park on Monday where we played on the equipment and saw Scientific forces in action! Our writing is already improving as we have written a recount including fronted adverbials and different conjunctions. We have also tried making our own parachutes and discussed the forces involved in how they work. Thank you for sending in the children's homework this week. This week's homework is maths!
Years 1 & 2	Years 5 & 6
In KS1 the children have been working very hard in their writing by changing a story they know by creating new characters and something they wish for. In maths, Year 1 have been working on 1 more and 1 less and equal to and year 2 have been spelling numbers in words as well as ordering numbers to 100 and using technical vocabulary like increasing and decreasing. In theme we have begun to look at materials and their properties by making comparisons of different substances. It has been another great week here in KS1. Nearly all the children have got a PE kit in school, thank you.	Year 5 have had an exciting week measuring hand span, arm span, height and head circumference. We are looking forward to our exciting Fashion Show where we will show our favourite clothes and poems. We look forward to seeing parents/carers there! Year 6 have had a fabulous time at Whitemoor Lakes. Please see the school's website for photos. Thank you to parents for ensuring the children were well-equipped for their adventures this week. For children who have been prescribed an asthma inhaler and do not have it in school, parents/carers will be contacted immediately to bring one in. Asthma is far from a minor ailment and is in reality, a killer, when it all goes wrong.
