


## **An Amazing Curriculum**

The job of a teacher extends way beyond actual classroom teaching. One thing we have all been working on both before the closure of schools and since, is the redesigning of our school curriculum.

For many years' schools across the country have focused greatly on the 'core subjects' of reading, writing and maths. These have been prioritised for obvious reasons and schools have been 'judged' for many years on how they achieve in these subjects; Early Years Good Level of Development, Year 1 Phonics screening test, SATs in Years 2 and 6 are all used as key indicators for a school's performance.

Ofsted issued a new Inspection framework in September 2019 which directed schools to give more priority to other subjects in the curriculum as well as just reading, writing and maths. This is something teachers have felt important for a long time!

Here at Chadsmead, we have always recognised the importance of the wider curriculum and given time and careful thought into what is involved in each theme we teach. Each theme has received or IS receiving a complete overhaul as teachers spend huge amounts of time carefully mapping every single lesson that is taught.

The subjects we are focussing on are:

Science, Geography, History, Art, DT, RE, PE, Music, Modern Foreign Languages (French), PSHE. Each subject is specified in the National Curriculum with lots of different sections for each Year group.

Updating our curriculum is a huge task but one we are extremely confident will be better than ever when we return to school!
