This was well attended and gave a valuable insight as to how children learn to read and the importance of phonics being the beginning of establishing fluent and confident readers. 

Nursery & Reception	Years 1 & 2			
Early Years have had a fantastic week learning all about 'Road Safety'. We would like to say a huge thank you for all of the sponsors made for our cycle. So far we have made a huge £176 which we will spend on new resources for the children (more details to follow). As well as the sponsored cycle the children have been learning about visibility, made their own vehicle, painted road signs, painted vehicles, made their own reflector and much more.	On Monday, the children walked to St Chad's church to learn about being baptised. On the way, to fit in with our Road Safety week, we identified different road signs and discussed how we should safely cross roads. The children displayed great attitudes to their learning. Our Road Safety learning has continued in the classroom, with the children gathering, displaying and understanding data; producing road signs; planning a Bee-bot journey and using road signs as a PE stimulus.			
	Can we please ask parents to ensure their children come to school with a coat, hat, scarf and gloves, ready for the colder weather we are expecting.			
Years 3 & 4	Years 5 & 6			
It's been a really important week for Year 3/4. We have been focusing on how to keep safe on the roads as part of Chadsmead's participation in Road safety Week.	Year 5/6 have had a very enjoyable and informative week this week. We have spoken about the basics of road safety; carried out a traffic survey and presented our results in a variety of ways; looked at stopping distances for vehicles at different speeds; identified hazardous zones in our locality and compared them to another location. Year 5 have written play scripts			
We have practised how to cross the road outside and followed this with a group discussion and a write up as a set of instructions.				
In writing we have written poems using a poetic structure after reading a poignant yet very relevant poem called 'If only'	about road hazards and how to overcome them. Year 6 have written quizzes about road safety as well as some persuasive writing about the importance of keeping safe as a pedestrian.




