Prior Knowledge Check: What do you already know? 1) How do we answer questions using the internet? We use a search engine! A safe, trusted search engine.

- Search engines normally offer you a choice between a UK-only or worldwide search. You are less likely to return illegal content by selecting a UK only search, as UK-hosted sites are subject to UK law and therefore easier to police.
- Ensure you use accurate search terms (words and phrases) in order to return the most accurate results, and avoid unwanted ones.
- Make sure you use correct spellings: even the slightest error can return unwanted results.
- Remember that not all the information in websites returned in searches is reliable.

Prior Knowledge Check: What do you already know? 2) What is a blog? A blog (a contraction of the term "web log")[1] is a type of website, usually maintained by an individual with regular entries of commentary, descriptions of events, or other material such as graphics or video. Entries are commonly displayed in reverse-chronological order. "Blog" can also be used as a verb, meaning to maintain or add content to a blog.

Think about what a biography should include. What is the key information that we need to find out about Henry VIII.


