

# What has your child been learning about in class this week?

#### Years 1 & 2

It's hard to believe that we have completed our first half term in Years 1 & 2! The children have learned so many new skills in maths, reading and writing. It is pleasing to see such good progress in such a short amount of time.

In maths, Year 2 have learned to use addition and subtraction facts that they already know to help them to add and subtract using 2-digit numbers. Year 1 have also been adding and subtracting by using the counting on or back method.

Writing has been great fun. We have learned about writing instructions and linked it to making a disgusting sandwich using unusual sandwich ingredients. I'm sure you have heard about these.

In theme, we have focused on the food part of our Muck, Mess and Mixtures topic and we have applied design and technology skills to design and make our own fruit salads.

HOMEWORK - all children will have a choice for their homework over the break. We will be beginning our new theme 'Land Ahoy' when we return to school. Take a look in your child's purple homework book for ideas to make something creative over the holiday.

Have a well-rested break everyone.

Years 1 & 2 will be having a dressing up day on Friday 5<sup>th</sup> November for our new theme 'Land Ahoy'. The children can come dressed as pirates or sailors or any ideas with a <u>nautical</u> (of the sea) theme.

#### Years 3 & 4

Years 3 & 4 have had a really different week this week. We have learned a brand new skill – weaving!

As part of our theme – Tribal Tales – we have learned how important it was for early people to make clothes. After researching the development of weaving we looked at some important vocabulary – WEAVE, WAFT, WARP, LOOM, THREAD. We then mapped out how exactly we would make our weave, one step at a time. Then we thought about colours, type of thread, loom size then chose our best design and began weaving.

We all managed to complete a piece of weaving and also recorded our work in a special booklet. It was a fun couple of days!

In other news, we have also finished our plants experiment with some interesting results - some of the plants were rather smelly especially those with no light or air whilst the others were able to grow successfully - some more than others!

Have a happy half term and see you back in school on Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> November for a brand new theme - Burps, Bottoms and Bile.

#### Years 5 & 6

Years 5 & 6 have had a full, stimulating and very enjoyable week this week. All classes have completed an Art project focusing on the artist Hans Holbein. We have created small, detailed parts of his painting of Henry VIII, then put them all together to make the full picture which has been very effective.

We have also enjoyed a DT day, the children have researched, designed, made and then evaluated a medieval device including moving parts. In addition, we have managed to complete our class text Treason, what a great book it has been to read.

Next half term we will begin a new theme Alchemy Island which we are very much looking forward to.

### Years 5 & 6 Art Classes

Years 5 & 6 have been recreating sections of Hans Hohlbein's famous painting of King Henry VIII. We used a range of materials to practise our colour mixing (wax crayon, watercolours, oil pastels, felt tip pens, pencil crayons and poster paints) to choose our final medium. We all agreed that watercolours were the best for colour matching.
