Message from Early Years

This week we have been continuing to read our new story 'Come on, Daisy!'. The children have tried really hard to write sentences about what Daisy did in the story.

In Maths Mastery this week we have been continuing to explore numbers within 10. We have been adding two single-digit numbers together using a ten frame and a number track.

In the classroom we have been completing lots of exciting activities such as making a handprint crab, exploring the under the sea small world, acting as pirates in the role play area, painting under the sea creatures, building simple words and writing lots of sentences about under the sea creatures.

During the afternoons we have been exploring ice. The children came up with some super adjectives to describe the ice and even had a go at writing them down. Some of the adjectives that the children thought of were **wet, slippery, hard, freezing, icy, drippy**.
