- Plastic milk bottle (4 pint may be better)
- PVA Glue
- Coloured paper or tissue paper
- Googly eyes
- Scissors
- Black Pen

Alternative list for this activity:

- Plastic milk bottle (4 pint may be better)
- Felt tip pens including a black felt tip
- Scissors
- White paper

Thursday 21st January - Miss Morton will be teaching another creative session where the children will be making a bubble painting. Things you will need:

- Washing up liquid
- Paints or food colouring to mix into the water
- White paper
- Water
- Drinking straw to blow bubbles

If you are unable to find these resources, you and your child can still attend the session as they will be able to talk to the other children in their class and watch Miss. Morton complete the activities.





We would like to welcome the children back to Nursery. It was lovely to see everyone's faces after Christmas.

The children have been settling back in to the Nursery routines and telling us all about what they had for Christmas.

This half term, we are talking about 'How Many Colours are in a Rainbow' and focusing on the story of Elmer the patchwork elephant. We designed our own elephants and have displayed them in Nursery on coloured paper so they look like a patchwork quilt.

We have also been talking about rainbows and learning about how rainbows are formed. We did an experiment using Skittles sweets and poured water onto them, watching what would happen to the colours. The children were asked to predict what would happen, and we had some amazing answers: "They might explode" "They might melt" "They might freeze"
