
World Book Day - Thursday 7th March 2019



Momo Challenge

On Tuesday, social media was inundated with talk of this 'viral game'. School received phone calls/e-mails and visits from worried parents and carers who did not know what this was about. Staff throughout the school heard children discussing this with their peers and bought this to my attention. In response to this I have provided a letter of information and directed parents to the National Online Safety guidance that has been produced.

I am, however, a little disappointed in the suggestion that school has contributed to this 'hype'. It is always very difficult to support parents and carers with issues regarding home use of the internet and as a parent I understand these. But the intention was to provide information and signpost you to help. At no point has any member of staff bought up this discussion with your children, they have only tried to ease worries and focus attention on more appropriate topics of conversation. Most recent news suggests that it is a hoax, regardless, your children have bought this into school.
