Next Friday is our first school Number Day, all the information about this is coming home in a separate letter. The children will spend the day focusing on number related activities. Thank you for your support.

#### **Attendance**

As has been mentioned previously, guidance from Staffordshire County Council around attendance issues has been updated. We sent a letter from the County Council on 8th December 2017.

Please take note of the key information and updated changes in the guidance and the published policy. In particular, I point out that:

- · No holiday can be authorised. Head teachers may not grant leave of absence for a holiday. Any/all holidays COULD result in a fine being issued.
- · Head teachers may grant leave of absence for exceptional circumstances. Exceptional circumstances are "exceptional"
- · Unauthorised persistent absence of 10 school days in a period of 12 school weeks COULD result in a fine.
- · 10 sessions of persistent late arrival arriving after registers have closed COULD result in a fine.
- If children arrive before registration has closed, they are marked "L" present, but late.

IN ALL CIRCUMSTANCES WHERE YOU INTEND OR PLAN TO TAKE YOUR CHILD OUT OF SCHOOL, YOU HAVE A LEGAL DUTY TO LET US KNOW.

We continue to thank the very large majority of our parents/carers who ensure that their children are in school, on time for each and every day establishing good habits and attitudes for future schools and the world of work and beyond. Thank you.
