As a school we appreciate and have sympathy for families that have been unable to book holidays over the last couple of years due to financial or travel restrictions. We understand that time spent with family is important and can offer a wealth of new experiences. Unfortunately, following the disruption of Covid, the Government has stated that all children are expected to attend school as normal and holidays cannot be authorised during term time. There are exceptional cases that may lead to an absence being authorised which are detailed in our 'Attendance Policy'. This policy can be found on our school website.

Years 1 & 2

This week has been a fabulous week in Years 1 & 2! It has been our 'Arts' week and we have been focussing on dance and drama. We had a super dance workshop based around 'The Lion King' which we used to show off in our Friday collective worship. We learned a dance, actions and a song. During the week, we made masks to wear during our performance. We learned about how performances are put together with all the people who are involved, like; actors, make-up artists, directors, stage hands etc.

The children thoroughly enjoyed their week of dance and drama activities.

Years 3 & 4

We have had such a great week this week in Years 3 & 4. It has been lovely to see the children get so enthused over Art week. We have done a real variety of art and DT.

The children have learned all

about an Italian artist called Guiseppe Arcimboldo from the 16th century. They loved making art from fruit and vegetables with Mrs Cadman and creating their own portraits and sketches.

We also designed our own model of the human digestive system and learned how to work collaboratively in a group of 4 or 5. These models have been labelled with explanation paragraphs.

It was also a fun day when we learned how to research, design and make our own pizzas. Perhaps the best part was cooking them in class and then eating them!

We also did painting in RE and managed to keep our daily walk to Lapland going - moving through France and Belgium. What a week!

Years 5 & 6

In our Arts Week, Years 5&6 have focussed on music. Probably the highlight of the week was when Year 6 took part in a concert in a concert in Lichfield Cathedral. Pupil behaviour was excellent as they rehearsed, attended choral evensong and then performed in the evening. This will be a day they will remember for a long time. We were very proud of them all. Other activities during the week for all of Years 5 & 6 have included composing sound stories with Mrs Cadman and journeys through Alchemy Island with Mrs Miles; listening to a live performance on a euphonium from Mark Glover; creating music on computers using Scratch with Mrs Mullen; listening and appraising with Mrs Dennis; exploring rhythm grids with Mrs Baines and considering their personal music choices with Mrs Swallow. We have covered all areas of the KS2 music curriculum, have maintained our reading of The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe and our theme work as well as continuing our daily sponsored walk towards Lapland! What a lot we have packed into one week!
