Parents and carers talking to children about the current national situation

Years 1 & 2

In maths, Year 1 have been finding the difference between two numbers, using cube towers as representations. They have worked systematically to find different possibilities to help them solve word problems. Year 2 have been finding halves and fractions of shapes and quantities, linking their learning with previous knowledge of division.

Our writing has been based on the Billy Bob Buttons book 'The Muffin Monster'. The children have planned a similar story of their own, changing the characters, the monster and how the monster is eventually captured. We look forward to reading the children's stories - they have some brilliant ideas!

In theme, we have learned some Science; using the acronym MRS GREN to help us work out if things are 'Alive', 'Dead (but once alive)' or 'Never Alive'.

Years 3 & 4

This week we have been studying the language used in a 'tale of fear'.

We have mapped a wide range of complex grammar used in this sort of descriptive writing including:

- expanded noun phrases
- fronted adverbials
- · adverbial phrases
- · ambitious adjectives and verbs
- the use of punctuation

We will plan and write our own frightening story next week. It has been an interesting week in our Jigsaw lessons as we have learnt about drugs. The children were very interested in the difference between healthy drugs used for medical purposes and other harmful drugs. Thanks for the input into home learning - the children who read regularly at home are the same children that make good progress in school!


Years 5 & 6



Easter Raffle


House Captains will be selling raffle tickets around school next week ready for the Easter Raffle, tickets are 50p each.
