Would you let your child speak to strangers? – Communication from Education Safeguarding head for Staffordshire County Council

According to fresh research from O2 and the NSPCC, one in four children have been contacted by someone they don't know across some of the most popular apps and games. The NSPCC has warned of the dangers of the game 'Fortnite' for its violent and predatory voice and text chat features in a new child safety warning. The game automatically lets users speak to other gamers using built-in voice and text chat functions. This allows children to be contacted by anyone else playing the game. While voice chat can be switched off via the settings menu, **text chat can't be disabled**, making it a potential danger for children who could be targeted by sexual predators and paedophiles. I know some parents may see the game as harmless as it only carries a PEGI 12 rating, but this rating does not take into account the chat and text features of the game. As parents, we are running the risk, if we do not monitor and safeguard the children in our care. If you do allow your child to play games online there are tips you could follow from the NSPCC. They recommend you follow these TEAM tips:

- Talk to your child regularly about what they are doing online and how to stay safe. Let them know they can come to you or another trusted adult if they're feeling worried or upset by anything they have seen.
- Explore your child's online activities with your child. Understand why they like using them and make sure they know what they can do to keep themselves safe.
- Agree your own rules as a family when using sites, apps and games.
- Manage your technology and use the settings available to keep your child safe.

Nursery & Reception

We have had a fantastic week in Early Years. Pupil Premium Pupils at Chadsmead

Criteria for Pupil Premium (Inc Free School Meals) as of 1st April 2018.

Parents/carers wishing to apply for free school meals should apply online at <https://apps2.staffordshire.gov.uk/web/fsmweb/> or contact the school office for information.

- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment and Support Allowance
- Eligible for Child Tax Credit **but not** Working Tax Credit and the household income (as used by HMRC to assess tax credits) is not more than £16,190. **Please note:** anyone eligible for Working Tax Credit, or if you have a partner and they receive it, regardless of Income, you will not qualify
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- In receipt of the 4 week run on of working tax credit (this is where someone becomes unemployed or reduces their hours and so is no longer entitled to working tax credit but will continue to receive it for a further 4 weeks and is entitled to free meals during that time)
- Universal credit (provided you have an annual net earned household income of no more than £7,400 as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods). Your net earned income is your household income after taxes and deductions and does not include income from Universal Credit or any other benefits you may receive.

Access to smaller class sized groups in Quality First teaching through the funding of Teaching Assistants in class based work

Access to smaller Guided reading groups across school through the funding of Teaching Assistants in class based work

Additional targeted support when not at Age Related Expectation in Reading, Writing, handwriting, maths (reviewed every six weeks)

Monitored closely for their school attendance by the school's Attendance officer and Head teacher.
