Message from Mrs Grainger

Around one in three people with coronavirus (COVID-19) have no symptoms, and so finding and isolating these hidden cases quickly will help to stop outbreaks before they get a chance to develop.

curriculum

What has your child been learning about in class this week?

Years 1 & 2

This week all of our classes in Key Stage One have been completing different theme activities!

Cherry class have had their week in the computer room and have been learning about digital writing. We have practised typing skills, where important keys are, such as the space bar and the enter button as well as how to change what the font looks like.

Apple class have been getting arty! We have been looking closely at animal prints and then drawing them onto polystyrene tiles. We then applied paint using a roller and used our tile to create prints into paper! We worked as a group to use our prints to fill in the outline of different animals.

Finally, in Elm class we have been completing lots of science activities based on animals. We have learnt about different habitats such as the desert, rainforests, oceans and the Arctic, exploring the plants and animals that live there and how they are suited to their environment. We also learnt that the plants and animals in particular habitats all depend on each other to survive.



Years 3 & 4

It has been a busy yet fun week in Years 3 & 4 again. The children have taken re-entry into school in their stride and are now back into their regular routine. It has been super to see how everyone has been helpful and kind to each other after the lockdown. We have 'discovered our fossils' by opening up our bread and jelly snakes experiment. The results were impressive and have given the children a real insight into the fossilisation process.

When Mrs Grainger came to the classroom, it was nice to hear Poppy in Year 4 give a beautiful explanation of her experiment's results. This included using some key vocabulary including: sand, sedimentary rock, pressure and fossilisation. The use of key vocabulary is something we give lots more emphasis to in all areas of the curriculum.

Years 5 & 6

Years 5 & 6 have this week focused on Geography during our theme lessons. We have looked at Mexico on a map, then located and plotted a variety of important landmarks. We have then learned about Biomes and identified which of these we would see in Mexico. Then we have specifically looked at the Chihuahuan desert.

In reading, we have continued to read our class text 'Holes'; in writing we have summarised information to create a comic strip and in maths we have continued with a range of arithmetic style questions.

Alongside all of this we have completed the majority of our termly assessments.
