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Why we teach Read Write Inc. Phonics?

- Last year we got fantastic phonics results
- RWI allows the children to become more confident and fluent readers.
- We are still using the same phonics but children are applying them to be a more confident and fluent reader.



Systematic approach- 60 minute lesson

We teach the sounds firstspeedy sounds




MTYT

How children learn by associating the picture with the sounds.

Teaching speed sounds in the same structure throughout the stages.

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Consonant sounds - stretchu



Simple speed sound chart which is displayed in classrooms- set 1 and 2 sounds on.

Training

Pure Sounds




We teach using pure sounds.

May be difficult at first because sometimes we say ('muh' not 'm' and 'ruh' not 'r', etc.) so that your child will be able to blend the sounds into words more easily.

Children need to know sounds – not letter names – to read words.


Blending and spelling using Fred (Fred fingers)



Fred helps children sound out words so they can read and spell.

Fred in your head- we teach them to say sounds in their head once they can sound out a word.

Red words



YOU CAN'T FRED A RED!

For example:

Said: the sound 'e' is written with the grapheme ai.



Simple Complex Speed Sounds chart

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Once children can Fred Talk and blend sounds- teach Set 3 sounds on the complex chart.

These are other ways of reading and writing each sound.

For example: igh as in light Split i-e as in bike ie as in pie y as in cry i as in silent



Storybooks



Stages Red Ditty-Grey

Each book is carefully matched to the sounds they can already read.



Story Green words- low frequency words that children have already been taught. Learn the meaning of words linked to the story.

Speed Sounds, Story Green words, Red words

Purpose: to help children read the words and sounds speedily.



Storybooks- children will read the story 3 times.

Accuracy

- Read and review new and previous sounds.
- Understand the meaning of new words.
- Sound out the name of characters and unfamiliar words
- Read the story.

Fluency

- Read the words speedily
- 'Jumping in' when the teacher hesitates
- Read the story with increased speed.

Comprehension

- Read the story with storytellers voice
- Answer questions about the story





Blue and Grey Stage





Children to read 70+ words in 1 minute Children to read 80+ words in 1 minute

By Summer term Year 1 need to be working towards the blue stage.

The Year 2 National Standard is that children need to read 100+ words in one minute.



What compliments the Read Write Inc scheme are the Book Bag Books...

We want our children to read the text with fluency and confidence. They will enjoy reading to you- If they can read the text it means they are reading at the correct level.



We do not send books home that the children cannot read because we always want them to be set up to succeed in their reading.



How to help your child...

- Read to your children (bedtime stories)
- Ask lots of questions and share opinions
- **Talk** to your child as much as possible and 'feed' them new and ambitious vocabulary.
- Get involved- use Fred talk, Fred fingers to spell.
- Use pure sounds
- Praise your child for using new words or interesting phrases
