Nursery Induction 2020

Ordinarily, we would be writing to you to invite you to a number of events and meetings. However, due to the current situation this is not possible.

We find ourselves in an unprecedented set of circumstances and anticipate the possible anxiety your family may currently feel about your child's transition into Nursery but we would like to assure you that an induction process of some kind will take place; however currently you will understand that we cannot be specific about how and when. Schools are working within a constantly changing environment, with different versions of guidance coming from the DfE on a daily basis. We therefore ask for your patience whilst we put together plans which are practical, flexible and above-all mutually beneficial in supporting the best possible start to your child's school life.

As you can imagine we are running school with a skeleton staff, following the government guidance, but we promise that we will be in touch soon to share our plans for induction once we are clearer about the way forward nationally. Included in this pack is some information to read in preparation for your child's start.

- **EYs Foundation stage leaflet:** This provides information about daily routines
- **All about me:** Please complete this with your child. In September we will use it as a display and a talking point with the children.
- **Supporting your child with settling into school:** An information sheet to support your child with starting school.
- **What to expect, when:** This includes statements related to the Early Years Curriculum. We have included 16-26 and 22-36 months old, however on the website you can access the whole document. You can look through the document and highlight what your child can do. We will ask for these forms back in September.
- **The road to school/ Am I ready for school:** This tracker helps you and your child prepare for school.
- **Information about Nursery hours:** All nursery children are entitled to 15 funded hours. If you would like to find out if you are eligible for 30 funded hours, please visit the government website: <https://www.gov.uk/apply-30-hours-free-childcare>

We shall also be in touch at the end of June/ beginning of July with various documents that collect data needed for starting school. If your child already attends a nursery and has been provided with a learning journey of their development please could you send this into school in September. This will allow staff to find out where your child is in their learning which will support the transition process.

Every single child in the country, that will start Nursery in the autumn term, will be in the same position as yours. Our promise to you is that we will continue to work in partnership, to ensure your child's start to school is both as exciting and positive as we can collectively make it. We look forward to welcoming you and your child into school once it is safe to do so.
