Mrs Parrish will start with us in January, but will be based around the school in the first few weeks.



Medication must be clearly labelled and stored securely in the school office. E.g. Your child has been prescribed antibiotics, they are well enough for school however they require medication to ensure a full recovery.

# Parking

Please could all parents/carers who need to bring a car to school to park appropriately. We have had a number of recent calls from residents who have complained that cars have been blocking driveways and pavements.
