At school we regularly talk to children about how mistakes are an important and natural part of any learning process (similarly to the mistakes which take place when learning to crawl, walk, talk, ride a bike and so on). After six months away from school (for most children) we are using praise, encouragement and positivity to boost children's self-esteem so that school is a positive and inspiring place to learn. Sometimes we may cover concepts that children may have forgotten but this is natural due to the break in learning. Again, encouragement from home and school will really support every child in believing in themselves, their successes and mistakes.

In class, we are encouraging all children to answer questions and to never be afraid of sharing an answer. I know that you will be having similar discussions with your own children at home.
