In maths this week we have learned to measure accurately objects using mms, cms and metres.


Years 5 & 6

Minster's Trail – new look heritage trail for children

Children are invited to go on Visit Lichfield's re-vamped heritage trail. Visit Lichfield has a new-look heritage trail for children called Minster's trail. Children can follow the Minster the duck on a circular tour of the historic city of Lichfield.

Using the trail's map, Minster's webbed feet will lead children and their families to key sites such as The Samuel Johnson Birthplace Musuem, Erasmus Darwin House, Lichfield Cathedral and Museum Gardens.

Along the way Minster the Duck asks a series of questions to get youngsters to take a closer look at their surroundings and to find out more about the city's heritage.
