Nursery & Reception

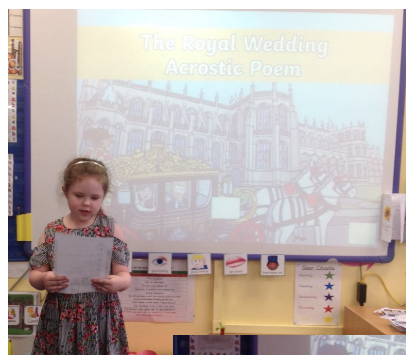
