


### Newsletter Friday 14th January 2022

The things I wish my parents had **known...about** online sexual harassment (Children's Commissioner)

The Children's Commissioner, Dame Rachel de Souza DBE, has recently published a guidance document for parents helping to support them to understand online sexual harassment. It is a sensitive topic, and not one all parents feel comfortable discussing with their children.

The commissioner's team brought together a group of 16 - 21 year olds and asked them talk about what they think parents should know, and what they should say to their children when talking about sexualised bullying and the pressures of growing up online.

Key advice from the young adults in the focus groups included:

- \* Start conversations early, before your child gets a phone or social media account. Keep the conversation going over time, adapting to your child.
- \* Young people want their parents to learn about new technology and trends, including risky behaviours and dangerous spaces online.
- \* Create a safe and trusting home environment. Young people told us the home environment is key, they want to share things with their parents but don't always feel able. The report and poster 'The things I wish my parents had known...' can be downloaded

## What has your child been learning about in class this week?

#### Years 1 & 2

During this week in Years 1 & 2 we have been busy starting our new theme 'Street Detectives'. Lots of children have brought some fantastic homework in to share and display in our classrooms.

We have started the week with an investigation to find out which materials will degrade over the next 5 weeks the fastest. We have started to find out about how maps are created using aerial views.

In computing, we are learning about photographic devices and how to take a 'good' photo.

In maths, Year 2 are continuing to learn about multiplication and division and Year 1 have been learning about adding and subtracting.

In English, we are continuing to focus on the story, 'The Journey' and this week have been identifying the verbs and finding synonyms to change and rewrite the text. All in all it has been a super start to the new term.

#### Years 3 & 4

It's been a busy week in Years 3 & 4.

We have been working really hard in our writing lessons as we learn to write our own poems. First of all, we read a poem linked to our theme learning called 'States of matter'. Next, we analysed the poem and deconstructed it. We looked at its features and their purpose e.g. title, introduction, verses, rhyming couplets and rhythm. After doing this we have examined rhyming sequences and how these work, as well as looking at rhythm and using a beat to keep this. Finally, to finish our poetry week we planned and wrote our own poems and ended by reading them to the class using good intonation.

This has worked well and complimented another recent focus in school which is whole school Oracy (Learning to talk and Learning through talk). We have been encouraging children to be more active in discussions by teaching them the skills to do so. This is something we will be doing more of on a regular basis and the children have responded well to this.

#### Years 5 & 6

Years 5 & 6 have this week thrown themselves into our new theme titled 'Revolution', which is all about the Victorian period. We have looked at a timeline of Victorian Britain and plotted events chronologically. Following that we have begun to look at Workhouses and what life would have been like living a life in poverty. This all links to our book titled 'Street Child' which we are really pleased to say the pupils are really enthusiastic about. In writing, we have been writing a recount of our Victorian school day experience on our first day back.

In maths, everyone has been working on fractions as well as continued revision of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

#### Years 5 & 6 Quick Question:

There are a few buildings around Lichfield that during Victorian times were used as a Workhouse. Do you know what these buildings are used for now?

Any parent/carer than can help their child find out and MyEd the answers into school will earn their child 5 house points.

# Changes to the self-isolation period for those who test positive for Covid-19

From Monday 17<sup>th</sup> January, people who are self-isolating with COVID-19 will have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6.

The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day. All test results should be reported to NHS Test and Trace.

If the result of either of their tests is positive, they should continue to self-isolate until they get negative results from two LFD tests on consecutive days or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest.

Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests or anyone who continues to have a temperature will need to complete the full 10-day period of self-isolation.

Please continue to keep school informed.
