


# Newsletter Friday 8th October 2021







# Message from Mrs Grainger

As we reach the end of the fifth full week in school it's heartening to see school life in full flow. Something we had to adapt significantly last year was our collective worship (you might call this assembly), we really missed the time spent together and the added depth it gives to our curriculum to experience learning this way.

We provide collective worship daily, and each weekday follow this structure:

Monday – This is whole school. It promotes and centres around theme days and personal and social values. It develops a sense of community spirit and explores own beliefs.

Tuesday – This is in key stages. We use a resource called Picture News where we share topical news and consider moral issues in the world around us.

Wednesday – This is for Years 1-6. Mrs Miles leads a hymn practice which allows the children to experience participation and the wealth of Mrs Miles musical knowledge. Singing in school was the activity most missed by the pupils last year.

Thursday – Class assembly. This links to our RE curriculum. The children have a 'think piece' that is based on fundamental British values but are linked to all major faiths. The emphasis is upon evoking a response from children which leads to reflection and thought.

Friday — Whole school Star Awards. We reinforce positive values by celebrating learning from the week and share outside school achievements. This develops a sense of community, promotes a common ethos and is everyone's favourite.

You might like to ask your children about the day's collective worship, prompting them on the subject, you might find some interesting discussions developing.

What has your child been learning about in class this week?

#### Years 1 & 2

Years 1 & 2 have been inventing their own stories in writing this week. We have created new characters and problems. In reading the children who are on accelerated reader have completed their second STAR reader test and have their new ZPDs in their reading diaries.

In maths the Year 2 children are using what they know about numbers bonds to 10 to derive facts for number bonds to 20. Our favourite maths phrase this week is..."If I know that (3+4=7) then I know that (13+4=17)". Year 1 children have been doubling, halving and comparing numbers to 10.

During our theme time we have been enjoying completing science investigations to find out which substances are stickier and if they are as good as glue for sticking craft items

#### Years 3 & 4

Years 3 & 4 have been really hard at work as we near the end of our 5th week in school.

We have been writing the most amazing stories of a monster being defeated by a hero. This has built on work from last week when we studied Beowulf. It is lovely to see how the children are using some of our grammar which we teach explicitly once a week. This week we have revised fronted adverbials by remembering the key words WHEN, WHERE and HOW something happens.

The children have also been enjoying a really gruesome lesson in History this week.

We have learned all about The Lindow man - a man found preserved in a peat bog near Manchester who lived at the end of the Iron Age. We have been amazed at how historians were able to find out the grisly details about how this poor soul met his death and even what he ate!

#### Years 5 & 6

Years 5 & 6 have this week continued to read Treason, we are really enjoying it, it is amazing how much detail and how many links there are to our Tudor theme.

In maths we have worked on the four rules and some problem solving in Year 6, whilst Year 5 have revised roman numerals and also worked on addition and subtraction. Writing has been explanation texts about Henry VIII's children which we have then followed up with more explanation texts related to Tudor torture! Very gory indeed!! We've also had a motivational speaker this week. He spoke a lot about positive thinking and believing in yourself. Anyone can achieve anything they put their mind to!

#### KS2 Harvest Festival

Regrettably we will be changing our plans for our Harvest Festival. You may be aware that Staffordshire rates of positive covid cases are higher than the national average, and Lichfield district itself has had a particularly sharp increase of cases since schools have opened. Therefore, we are taking precautionary steps to reduce educational disruption and the transmission of covid. We will not be inviting parents in to watch the Harvest festival. We shall continue to collect food for the Foodbank and hold our own service within school. We thank you for your understanding that these decisions are made with our children's education at the forefront.

The Nursery admission process for September 2022 is now open. To apply for a place in our Nursery please complete the application form available from the school office. The closing date for admissions is Friday 21st January 2022.

#### Attendance

We continue to carefully monitor attendance at school and work closely with our Education Welfare Officer. In line with the Department for Education guidance on absence, requests for holidays in term time will not be granted. The guidance makes it clear that headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. If your child is absent from school, please let the office know before 9am.
