


# **Newsletter Friday 13th November 2020**

CAN I ALSO REMIND ALL PARENTS THAT NO CHILD WHO IS SELF-ISOLATING SHOULD BE BROUGHT DOWN TO SCHOOL WHILST A BROTHER OR SISTER IS BEING DROPPED OFF OR COLLECTED. THIS BREAKS ALL THE MEDICAL ADVICE THAT WE ARE ASKED TO FOLLOW. THANKS TO ALL PARENTS AND CARERS WHO HAVE PUT PARTICULAR ARRANGEMENTS IN PLACE TO ALLOW SOME CHILDREN TO ATTEND SCHOOL WHILE OTHERS STAY SAFELY AT HOME.

Please be aware that staff will also be following government guidelines, meaning at times they will also be required to self-isolate due to their own needs or family members. This is in addition to general illness absence. The reality for all schools is running without a full workforce and we thank you for your understanding.

#### Years 1 & 2

In KS1 we have been very busy working on our 'Superheroes' theme. We had great fun using our sense of taste to identify our likes and dislikes of different fruit and vegetables. Not many of us liked the celerv!

We have been busy innovating (making changes) to the story 'Charlie's Superhero Underpants'. We came up with ideas to change the story character and what they lose, then write some super innovated stories.

In maths we have been using lots of manipulatives to help us with our working out. We have used number lines, tens frames and bar models.

#### **Years 3 & 4**

It's been an interesting week in Years 3 & 4.

We have had Maple and Chestnut classes both following their regular timetables of morning lessons (maths, writing, reading) and afternoon lessons of theme and PE, Jigsaw, Maths Meetings and Timestable Rockstars. They have enjoyed learning how to use inverted commas correctly and also reading more of our book The Firework-Maker's daughter. It has provided some excellent opportunities for retrieval and inference style questions which we are getting better at answering. Children have also shown a real interest in Tremors - our theme. This enthusiasm has been reflected in the homework which has been sent in. It is amazing, many thanks for your help in getting the children to be creative. After quarantining the work sent in, we will make it into a display.

Sycamore class have spent most of the week learning Computing. We have learnt all about how digital devices work and tried to analyse advantages/disadvantages between using digital or non-digital devices. We had lots of fun producing a digital painting and comparing this to a 'regular' painting!

## Years 5 & 6

In theme lessons, Years 5 & 6 have been looking at timelines of different civilisations. We have compared empires, have discussed the land use of each empire and began to consider what led to the dissolution of each.

In writing, we have begun to create persuasive texts about Egypt and in reading we are continuing our class text, 'Secrets of a Sun King'. Maths for Year 5 includes squared and cubed numbers and Year 6 have worked on factors, multiples and prime numbers.

Thank you for the wonderful homework that was completed over the holidays. Examples of this will be displayed in the hall.
