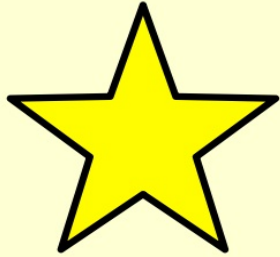

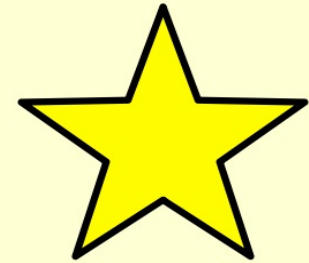

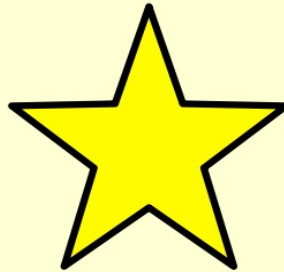

Can you find Mexico?





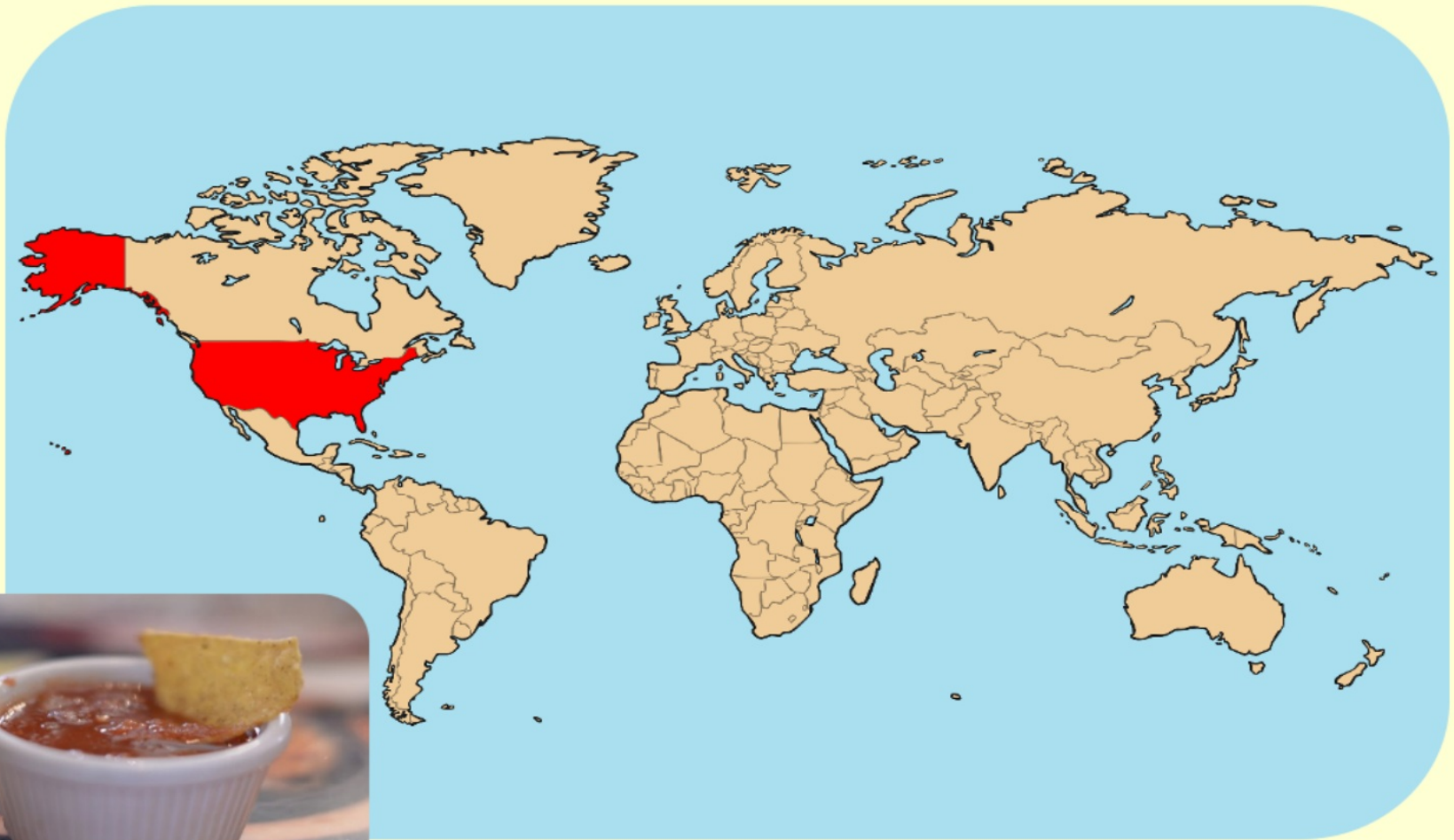
Salsa

Can you find India, Pakistan and Bangladesh?





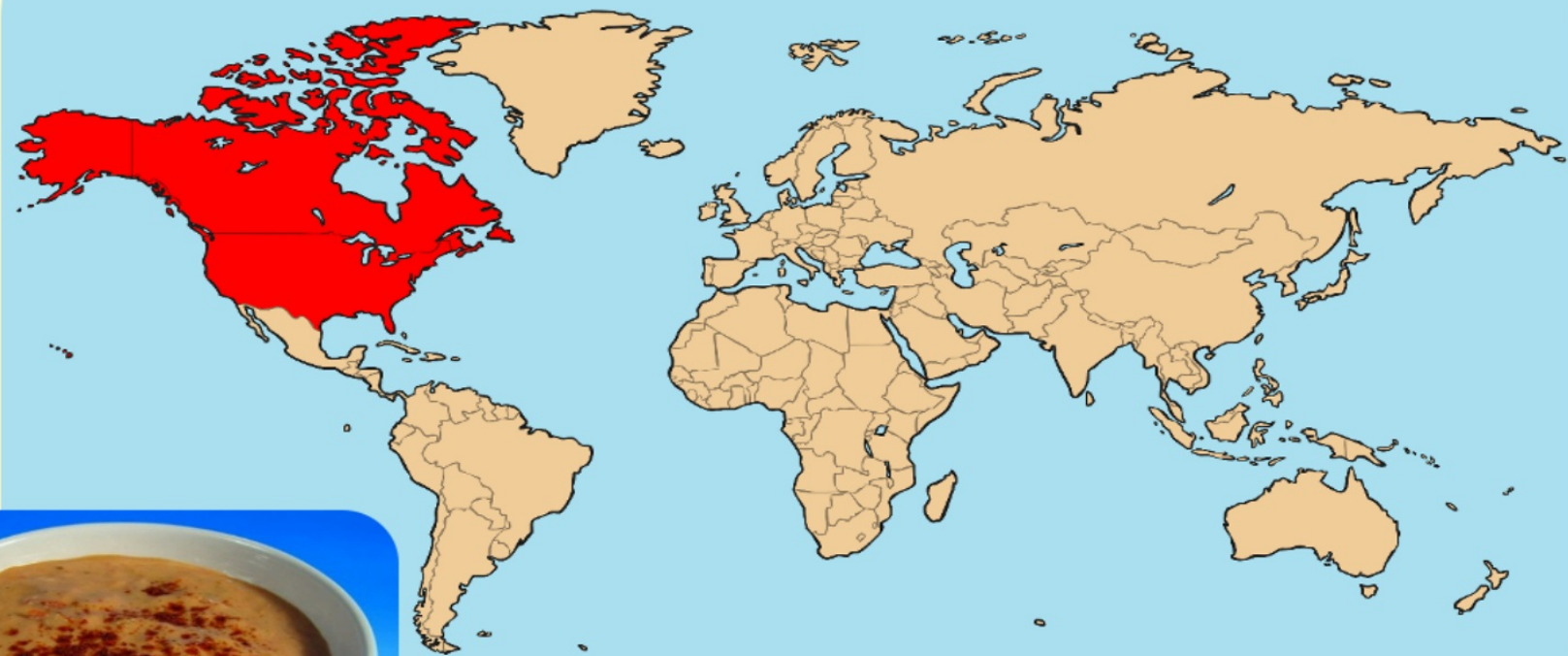
Thousand Island

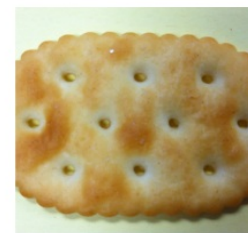
