## Message from Headteacher


As previously mentioned, we are transforming our home reading system for children who have completed their phonics learning (Y2-6). This means the previous colour bands you may know are no longer relevant. Please do not be alarmed when your child's home reading book comes home with a new colour banding. The new system, based on Accelerated Reader, will be explained to your children next week and a letter to yourselves will follow shortly after. We are excited to introduce this widely successful approach reading.

A reminder that our Y1/2 Mathematics Mastery workshop is on Tuesday 22nd January 2019 at 2:15pm in Beech classroom. Please come to the main office to sign in. The workshop will be an opportunity to share how children learn in Maths and ideas for you to help at home. We strongly encourage you to attend if you can.




Spellings are very similar and it is great to see the difference that 5 minutes a night or so really does make!

Venue	Adult and child course (mixed age sessions 0-4 years) — suitable for adults who do not access other children's activities and /or are wary of being in a group situation.  The course encourages adults to interact and play with their child, to understand basic child development, and encourage their child to make choices and explore new activities. Lots of support for the adults to manage their child's emerging behaviours and develop realistic expectations of their child's development, while trying a range of different activities.  Can be used as part of a contact arrangement.	Suitable for adults 19 year + who are struggling with their child's behaviour; mealtimes/ bedtimes/ lack understanding of how to talk and listen to their child, set fair consistent boundaries, consequences and rewards.  The course focuses on children's behaviour that are between 0-11 years primarily.	Suitable for adults – 19 years + who have poor mental health, struggle to go out and about or meet new people, who do nothing for themselves because their family situation dominantes their week. A low key course where adults can take their time to settle into the sessions – but offers opportunities to try new craft activities which can easily be reproduced at home/ gain confidence to be in a group situation.
