Nursery & Reception

Inspection of support for children and young people with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND)

Between Monday 12 November and Friday 16 November, Ofsted and the Care Quality Commission (CQC) will jointly carry out an inspection of support for children and young people who live in Staffordshire and have special educational needs and/or disabilities.

Whilst our school or setting has not been selected by the inspection team to be visited as part of the inspection, we want you to be aware of it and how you can provide feedback.

The inspection will look at three key things:

1. How well the needs of children and young people with SEND are **identified**
2. How well the needs of children and young people with SEND are **met**
3. The **outcomes** for children and young people with SEND

When the inspection has ended, a report will be published with the findings. It is expected to be before the end of December 2018.

How children, young people, parents or carers can provide feedback

Feedback from parents or carers of children and young people who live in Staffordshire and have special educational needs and/or disabilities is a vital part of the inspection process.

The inspectors would like to hear about experiences from September 2014 onwards, which is when the most recent SEND reforms were put in place.

Children, young people, parents and carers can feedback by:

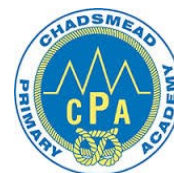
