This is very upsetting for children, who are sat worried. Where children are collected late from school on a regular basis, the school complete records which may be used to make a referral to the Educational Welfare Service and the matter followed up with the parents/carer.

In maths, Year 2 have been learning times tables and Year 1 have been learning about telling the time by o'clock and half past.

It's been busy in Years 3 & 4!

We've had a lot of challenges in maths this week with Year 3 learning all about the inverse relationship between multiplication and division. We have used arrays to work out all the different factors of a number and now also understand the term 'multiple'. There has been some excellent perseverance at this when it has got quite difficult! In Year 4, we've been adding and subtracting fractions with the same denominator of which the children have showed some good understanding. In theme, we have studied how many creatures have adapted to their habitat - especially sea creatures. Some great discussions have come from this.

The children have also enjoyed their guided reading which is a play script version of the novel Treasure Island.

Years 5 & 6

Years 5 & 6 have this week continued their extended writing information text about King Henry VIII and his six wives. We as teachers have been extremely impressed by the knowledge of many of our children. We have also produced a precis of Henry's Great Matter and continued to focus on theme related vocabulary.




I feel I need to inform you that several of the parents with children (approx. 30) were crossing further up the Weston Rd and not using the Crossing Patrol. This has implications, two fold, firstly it lowers the child count which may give a lower category or indeed may lead to the crossing being disestablished as not making criteria. Secondly it teaches the children bad habits and gives them the impression that it is ok to dodge the traffic.
