Message from Mrs Grainger

The importance of daily personalised reading practice cannot be overstated. Studies indicate that when students spend 25 minutes a day reading suitably challenging books which they successfully comprehend (demonstrated by achieving 90% or more on the reading practice quiz), then they will achieve optimal reading age growth.

In school, for children who have finished the phonics scheme, we timetable 15mins of dedicated reading time nearly every day to support this, but it is clear, this has to work alongside reading at home - <u>daily</u>.

We continue to send reading books home during the pandemic and have developed a safe system of issuing and returning books:

- Books are returned to a box in the classroom, where they are left for 48hrs, before being cleaned and returned to shelves by an adult
- Children are accompanied to the libraries by an adult
- Hand sanitiser is used before and after visiting the library
- Those children on phonic reading books are required to only bring their books in on a FRIDAY for changing.

Everyone has access to the dedicated online book-searching tool www.arbookfind.co.uk

Here you can identify appropriate books and source them yourself, whilst still bringing them to school to read during the day and quizzing. After you could always donate them to school.

Parents/carers are the most important educators in a child's life and it's never too early or too late to read together.



Social Distancing

Please could we remind parents/carers to socially distance when entering the school grounds, particularly when waiting for your child/ren. Years 1 & 2

This week the children in Years 1 & Year 2 have started to learn about non-fiction reports. We are learning about the moon landing and the astronauts that landed there in 1969. The children have learned lots of new facts.

We have all been adding and subtracting in our maths lessons. We have been partitioning numbers and quantities and adding groups together and subtracting amounts.

In our theme work we have been investigating different materials to find out which are the most suitable to use as a coat for keeping an alien dry.

REMINDER: We provide fruit snacks at break time for all children but it is fine for you send in a different or additional healthy snack for your child.

Years 3 & 4

Hello all. It's been a wonderful week in Years 3 & 4. We have had an interesting time in Theme experimenting with levers. It has been interesting for the children to discover how levers work and their everyday application.

We have used various loads and tried to move them with different amounts of force. Children have produced some well labelled diagrams about this.

It has also been great fun seeing how enthusiastic everyone is to do the Timetables Rockstars' 3-minute challenge. This is done each day in class often to some cool tunes (Mr Budge's idea of cool is sometimes not quite the same as the childrens'!) However, children are getting better all the time and those who practise at home regularly are zooming along!

Thank you for your support with this it really helps! Finally, please make sure you have signed up to Maths with Parents. We are giving out Maths homework on this site but need enough parents and carers in each class to login and create an account first.
