**Some gentle reminders for everyone's safety**

# curriculum

## What has your child been learning about in class this week?

### Years 1 & 2

Can you believe it's almost the last week of November? It's that time of the year when many of us are beginning to think about the Christmas festivities. In KS1 we have started to practice our performance 'The Christmas Recipe'. We have been learning the songs that go with it and those children who have chosen to have a speaking part have been practising their lines. Your child should have brought home a note explaining which character they are playing and the type of costume they will need.

In our everyday lessons, we have been making changes to the story of 'Pirate Tom' by creating our own characters and settings and we are learning to plan our ideas for our writing. In maths, Year 2 have continued to learn about measuring using metres, rulers, tape measures and centimetres. Year 1 have been continuing their work on shape.

Our theme work has focussed on Geography and we have been learning about maps, the United Kingdom, seas and capital cities as well as continents and oceans around the world.

Homework this week will be maths on Learning with Parents. Year 2 pupils, remember to use Times Table Rockstars every week too.

**REMINDER:** Children reading accelerated reader books must bring their reading books to school every day so that they can read them during their independent reading time during the day. Spelling books must be sent in every Tuesday so they can be marked indicating the number of correct spellings in their test and new spellings given.

### Years 3 & 4

Years 3 & 4 have been getting back to our regular timetable this week after last week's Art week.

We have been writing some excellent explanations of the human digestive system with a strong emphasis on using the correct vocabulary.

Thanks very much for sending in the story or 100-word mini-saga set as last week's homework. This is an external competition into which we will enter all the children's work. Already we have seen some great short stories. The deadline for these to come back to school is next Tuesday (30th December).

In maths this week, Year 3 have been learning to subtract with exchanging band, Year 4 have been multiplying using the short written method. Children are really getting into answering questions in their maths lessons using full sentences and again, exact vocabulary.

Next Tuesday is our trip to the Pantomime which we are looking forward to.



### Years 5 & 6

Years 5 & 6 have this week had assessment week and so the children have taken tests in reading, VGPS and maths; they have also completed some independent writing. In addition to this the teachers have taken an extra close look at their books. We have been extremely pleased and impressed by everyone's attitude to learning, we know everyone is different, all we ever ask is for the children to do their best and we reiterate this constantly.

As well as assessments both reading and theme have carried on as normal. Therefore, we have continued to read our script of The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe and we have been focusing on geography skills (map work and grid references) in theme.

We are now approaching Sweden as a part of our walk to Lapland. If you haven't yet collected sponsors please do, your support is gratefully received.

### Flu Immunisation Programme

Children in Reception up to and including Year 6 are having their flu immunisation on Thursday 2nd December 2021. All this involves is a quick sniff and it's over and doesn't hurt at all. You should now have received a link to access an online form in order to accept or decline this year's vaccine. Following flu immunisation, some children, and indeed adults, can experience a slightly raised temperature for a few days after. This is seen as a normal reaction to the immunisation, but given that we are all on the lookout for raised temperatures at the moment, along with other symptoms, like a continuous cough and a loss of smell and taste, etc., if you are in any doubt, please seek medical advice via the known channels.


