Message from Headteacher

This week we had a maths focus week, with the theme being money. Across the school, children engaged in MoneySense workshops - developed by NatWest Bank. Although the teaching of money is part of the curriculum, this week enabled us to teach the wider elements and make it more real life.

We have had over 50 parents and carers visit school this week to take part in workshops with their child. In Years 1/2 they held Mathematics Mastery sessions and in Years 3/4 they held Guided Reading sessions. Comments have been overwhelmingly positive and we look forward to offering more next term.



A huge thank you to the team of volunteers that came to Tea and Tidy on Saturday (9th November). With a herculean effort they began to remove the bamboo from the front of the school. The bamboo was so well established that some roots took 2 or more people to lift!! This area is to be a sensory garden. Years 1 & 2

Years 1 & 2 have continued their 'Land Ahoy!' theme, deciding what they would like to find out about pirates. They have looked at pirate ships and are beginning to identify different parts of sailing vessels.

In writing, the children are innovating the story of Pirate Tom; changing details such as the characters and settings, as well as adding some character dialogue.

In maths, we have enjoyed a focus on 'Money', with the children counting up in denominations of 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p and 50p in order to find money totals. Thank you to all parents/carers who came and participated in a maths lesson with their child - we hope you found this an informative session. Please return the feedback and evaluation form your child has brought home for you. Future parent/carer sessions will be offered to any parent who was not able to attend.

Years 3 & 4

Years 3 & 4 have been great mathematicians this week solving all sorts of money problems. We have learnt how to order money, give change and add money using column addition.

In our theme lessons we have completed detailed timelines for the Anglo Saxon period 400 AD - 787 AD. These have included pictures and explanation sentences.

In our Jigsaw lesson we have spent time investigating what similarities and differences our families have. It has been interesting hearing the children share their thoughts on what a family is.

Everyone has also seemed to enjoy the PE theme this week - learning to plan, create and perform parts of a dance linked to the Vikings!


We have also planned and written our own newspaper reports on a Viking journey from our group reading book.

Years 5 & 6

Years 5 & 6 have had an enjoyable maths week focusing on money and finance: we have looked at budgets and a variety of financial documents; discussed emotions that may be involved related to various situations; planned a party and investigated a scenario related to fraud and e-safety. Many money related word problems have also been answered.

In addition, Year 5 visited Nether Stowe on Monday to take part in an Escape Room activity and a few Year 5s visited the Friary on Tuesday to do some scaled drawing. Our theme has also continued, we have researched portals using our iPads and laptops and we have also looked at physical features on a map and used contour lines.


