


# **Newsletter Friday 6th November 2020**





# Message from Mrs Grainger

Welcome back. Although there have been significant changes during the half term holiday, with the tier status in Staffordshire and then the National restrictions from 5 November, learning at Chadsmead remains a constant. The Government have stated that schools will not close in this period and that education for our children remains of upmost importance. School attendance remains mandatory.

At Chadsmead, we consider our protective measures to be comprehensive. Ventilation is one of our crucial measures. Since September, classroom windows have been opened to ensure good ventilation around school. This will continue, even though the weather will be worse. We will turn the heating to an increased temperature, but families need to be aware that this does mean the temperatures in classrooms and around school will be lower. This is unfortunately a direct consequence of the control measures we have to maintain. To ensure your child remains comfortable in class, we would suggest ensuring they wear a vest, thermal or round neck white t-shirt under their school uniform. As an extra layer of clothing, children could also wear a plain, preferably blue/dark coloured fleece (without large logos) over the top of their jumper/cardigan, we think this is a good idea. You will also have noticed painted areas appearing at the drop off and collection points. Please do not stand in the yellow chevron areas, this protects both yourselves and staff members. Maintaining the 2m distance from other parents and carers is still a priority, even if you have children in the same class. You might also like to wear masks at these times and we recommend that you do on school grounds.
