Years 1 & 2

Years 1 & 2 have read 'The Town Mouse and the Country Mouse', in preparation for writing a journey tale. In maths, Year 2 have begun to learn more about 'Time'. Year 1 have finished their unit on 'Time' and will welcome the challenge of you asking them o'clock and half-past times. In ICT, as part of learning how to stay safe online, we spoke about what can happen when unkind words are said and heard.

Years 3 & 4

Years 3 & 4 have shown real enthusiasm this week when learning about the Iron Age.

We have discovered all about a preserved body, from 2000 years ago. called Lindow man. The children were keen to find out facts about this discovery and amazed at how he met a grizzly end! They are now converting their facts into a piece of Theme writing.

Something which the children have also developed a liking for is our Maths Meetings - a relatively new concept. We hold these 3 or 4 times a week in the afternoons and ask the children a wide range of quick-fire Year 3 and Year 4 maths questions. They are quite pacy and the children are excellent at answering every question in full sentences e.g. 'What fraction is largest: 1/2 or 2/3?'

'The fraction that is largest is 2/3'

Finally, staying with maths, it is great to see how many children have been on Rock Star times tables! Already we can see it having an impact!

Years 5 & 6

Year 5 & 6 have pleasingly continued to work hard this week. They have produced some lovely heart pictures and learnt about Dr William Harvey. They have also thought about the effect of smoking and completed some circuit training.

Safety Internet Day – Tuesday 5th February

The NSPCC latest guidelines for parents place a huge emphasis on the TEAM approach:

T - Talk to your child about what they are doing and how to stay safe online

E - Explore their accounts and behaviour online

A - Agree rules as a family in terms of use and times. Remember ultimately you are the adult, you are in charge

M - Manage settings to keep your child safe

As a parent, I understand the difficulties of this. It is tough and can cause world war 3 in the home, when you broach the subject and perhaps have to insist on certain time limits, use or non-use of certain apps or games. But DO NOT AVOID the fact that despite the short term pain it is totally worth it in keeping your child safe. TAKE CONTROL AS ADULTS AND INSIST THAT YOUR CHILD FOLLOWS GUIDELINES FOR THEIR OWN SAFETY. You would not leave your child alone anywhere in your home with a stranger without checking. Just be aware of chat rooms and the pitfalls. Thank you, Mrs Grainger.

Safety advice for children in the cold weather

Safety advice for children as it gets colder. We want to inform them to stay away from frozen rivers, lakes and ponds.

The weather is getting colder so Staffordshire Fire and Rescue Service wanted to make your students aware of the dangers of frozen water. Iced over water has dangerously low temperatures which would be a real shock to the system and means that people can very quickly get into difficulty.

Our advice is as follows:

* Make sure children understand how dangerous it is to play on ice. Tell them to stay away from frozen rivers, lakes and ponds.


*Don't wander too near to the edge, icy or wet conditions could cause you to slip and fall in

* Don't be tempted to test the thickness of the ice; it's easy to slip from the bank and fall through into the freezing water

* Dog owners should ensure they keep their pets on a lead so they are not at risk of falling in

* If you see someone, or a pet, fall through ice and get into difficulty do not risk yourself by trying to rescue them - instead ring 999 and ask for the fire and rescue service immediately.

Staffordshire Fire and Rescue's website <u>contains a</u> <u>short film</u> which highlights the dangers of children playing on ice. We would be very grateful if you would share this with children of a suitable age within your school.
