Message from Mrs Grainger

Big Battery Hunt – We have had an amazing response to one of the largest recycling challenges in the UK. We have collected an astounding amount of batteries. Our school collection bin was not big enough! In a week where the recycling of plastic has made the national news, we should be proud of our contribution to the Environment Plan.

Congratulations to Miss Robinson who has gained the EPICT Online Safety Certificate. This internationally recognised qualification shows the schools commitment to keeping children safe online. As a school we are also working towards the 360 Degree Safe Award. We are currently at stage 2 of this process (Certificate of Progress).

Polite Reminder: Since our return after Easter (7 school days). We have had 42 items dropped into the office for delivery to children. These items range from; lunchboxes, water bottlers, PE kits, snack money, and musical instruments. I ask that you encourage your children to be more independent and prepared for school. Thank you for your support.

Over the coming weeks we shall be having our heating system upgraded. This is a substantial amount of work across both buildings. It will involve all radiators being changed and both boilers. There will be some disruption, as you would expect, but I am confident that the company carrying out the work (who routinely work in schools) will be considerate to our needs. Year Group Updates

Nursery & Reception

This week in Early Years we have been completing lots of exciting activities and challenges such as building castles, measuring beanstalks using cubes, writing about our visit from the wolf last week, painting characters from traditional tale stories, practising writing our numbers and letters. We have also predicted and carried out an investigation to see what would happen to the gingerbread man when we put him into water.

Year 1 & 2

This week, Years 1 and 2 have had a very busy time. We have conducted a plant experiment, written and performed a song about planting seeds and we have dissected and named parts of a plant.

In Maths, Year 2 have been adding two digit numbers on a blank number line and Year 1 have been adding and subtracting one digit numbers from two digit numbers. Finally, in English both years have been adapting the tale of Jack and the Beanstalk.

Year 3 & 4

We have had a very musical week in Year 3/4. The children have loved listening to various styles of singing including Jazz, Scat, Yodelling and Overtone singing. We then located these on our world maps.

Also we began planning a piece of writing on a style of music after listening to 8-9 different genres including Big Band, Rock n Roll, Disco, Funk, RnB, Pop and Indie. This was met with great interest and lots of different dance styles!

We have also planned a Biography on a famous musician which we will write up from our notes.




