Tudor Buildings

What were Tudor Houses made of?

Tudor Houses were made of:

- wooden frames.
- gaps filled with woven twigs (wattle)
- dung (daub) smeared over the top.

Tudor buildings were the first to have glass in the windows. You had to be wealthy as glass was very expensive. If families moved house they would take the glass with them.



Tudor houses were built between 1485 – 1603 and they had a very distinctive black-and-white style appearance.
