Our Children and Social Media

There are plenty of good things about social media — but also many potential dangers and things that you want your children to avoid. They don't always make the smartest choices when they post something to a site like Facebook, snapchat or YouTube, and sometimes this can lead to problems.

Please spend a moment to read through these helpful hints with your children.

Be nice. Mean behaviour is just as unacceptable in the virtual world as it is in the real world.

Make it clear that you expect your children to treat others with respect and courtesy and to never post hurtful or embarrassing messages about others. And ask them to always tell you about any harassing or bullying messages that others may post.

Think twice before hitting "enter." Remind children that what they post can be used against them. For example, letting the world know that you're off on vacation or posting your home address gives would-be robbers a chance to strike.

Follow the "WWGS?" (What Would Grandma Say?) rule. Reinforce the point that "once it's out there, you can't get it back." This is a Digital Tattoo. They shouldn't share anything on social media that they wouldn't want their teachers, future bosses — and yes, grandma — to see.


Use privacy settings. Privacy settings are important and to highlight their importance, go through the settings together to make sure your children understand each one.

Don't "friend" strangers. "If you don't know them, don't friend them." This is a plain, simple — and safe — rule of thumb.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE IN TERM TIME - PLEASE NOTE CAREFULLY

Please be aware that we are still administering leave of absence requests during term time and the consideration of penalty notices under the interim criteria and guidance from the County Council - issued in July 2016.

Following the ruling on the Isle of Wight Council v Platt case we are expecting new guidance from the authority in the next couple of weeks. This new guidance is expected to come into effect from January of 2018. We will advise you when we have further information to clarity the position of Staffordshire County Council.

Current guidance is as follows: -

Penalty Notices for leave in term time may be considered appropriate if the following criteria is met: For unauthorised leave of absence, there must be a minimum of 20 sessions (10 school days) of unauthorised absence from school during the period of two consecutive half-terms (this being the half-term we are currently in plus the previous half-term)

This absence must include at least 10 sessions (5 days) of unauthorised leave in the specified time period for leave of absence for a holiday, however, the remaining 10 sessions (5 days) may relate to other unauthorised absence. The absences do not have to be consecutive

Persistent late arrival at school after the register is closed, in the current and previous term. 'Persistent' means at least 20 sessions of late arrival. These late episodes do not need to be consecutive

The presence of an excluded child in a public place at any time during school hours in that child's first five days of exclusion. An 'excluded child' is one who has been excluded from school for a given period under the Education and Inspections Act 2006

A Penalty Notice will not be issued in respect of children in the care of the Local Authority whom other interventions will be used

Penalty Notices are currently £60 per child, per parent and parents can receive more than one Penalty Notice per academic year.

Keeping our communities safe and reassured

Following on from last week's terrorist incident in London, I wanted to provide reassurance to you and your communities'.

As a result of this attack and the increased security threat level to Critical, we are working across the whole of the county with our key partners and stakeholders to address any specific concerns.

While there is no specific intelligence or threat within Staffordshire, the threat level means an attack is imminent.

As a result there will be an increased police presence and visibility, both armed and unarmed at popular locations including tourist spots, transport hubs and busy town centres across Staffordshire. We will also be reviewing key events over the coming days and providing security advice where practical.

Events like last week's highlight that an attack can occur at any time or place, without warning. As a result we would urge everyone to remain vigilant and report any suspicious activity to us, as a matter of urgency.

Our communities may question if they should call the police but I would encourage you to share the message, if something doesn't feel right call the confidential hotline on 0800 789 321, or in an emergency always call 999. We act on all information.

We know that at times like this people will be worried about the local impact and we continue to provide as much reassurance as possible, to ensure our communities feel safe and are safe. Terrorists want to create discord, distrust and create fear, so we stand together to defeat terrorism and would encourage everyone to work with us and support others.

We will continue to work with our colleagues and communities to keep you safe. Once again I cannot stress enough if you see anything suspicious please report it.
