

In KS1 we have had a great start to the new year. We started with a theme day on Monday where we learned about the different types of homes that people live in and the most common type of home in our class.

We started to think about the environment and the impact plastic has on it. We have started an investigation to find out which materials degrade in salt water.

Our English is based on the story 'The Journey' by Neil Griffiths. In maths, Year 1 have been using number lines and tracks to add and subtract and Year 2 have been creating and interpreting data.

Welcome back to Years 5 & 6, we hope everyone had a great Christmas and New Year.



We are looking forward to receiving the homework given over the holiday, to be in for next Tuesday, where the children were asked to research one of Henry VIII wives and draw her portrait.


It has been pleasing to see that most children have returned with enthusiasm and ready to learn.

Aiming High Activities for pupils for SEND

A wide variety of activities are available for children and young people aged 0-25 years old with a Special Educational Need/Disability (SEND).

- Activities include trips out, sports, youth clubs, outdoor activities and much more!
- Some activities are open to the whole family while other activities are for children and young people to attend independently.
- Children and young people can access a set amount of FREE activities each month (usually 1 a month with extra during school holidays).
- Access to additional activities can be made by making a financial contribution.

Activities are available to children and young people with a Special Educational Need or Disability (SEND) and their families who live in Staffordshire.

2 free places are available to each child/young person in February and these can be booked from the 2 - 11 January 2020.

Following this, additional activities for which there will be a charge can be booked also.

The Customer Service Centre is open from 9am - 5pm Monday - Friday (excluding bank holidays).




Lost Property
