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Community Academies Trust CEO honoured in the 2018 New Year Honours

The Chief Executive Officer and Founding trustee of Community Academies Trust has been awarded the OBE in the 2018 New Year Honours for services to Education.

Philip Hamilton was Headteacher at The Polesworth School until 2015 and co-founded Community Academies Trust in November 2012. He said the award recognised the achievements of the Trust collectively.

Philip Hamilton said, "I am very proud to receive this award. I am also humbled as this is real recognition of the work and incredible achievements of staff across our organisation. Our collective efforts are influencing the life chances of 7000 young people and providing professional opportunities for our 1200 staff across 14 schools."
