

What has your child been learning about in class this week?

Years 1 & 2

During this week in Years 1 & 2 we have been working on our 'Muck, Mess and Mixtures' theme. We have been inspired by the artists Paul Klee and Mark Rothco who have used primary and secondary colours to create abstract art. The children have produced some amazing abstract art work.

In our writing we have made changes to the story 'The Disgusting Sandwich' and thought of synonyms for the word disgusting, to create a new title and changes to the places that the sandwich goes. We have planned and re-written the stories using our new ideas.

In maths Year 2 have been looking at increasing and decreasing number patterns and using the symbols < and > to compare greater than and less than. Year 1 have continued to focus on number bonds and have started to look at doubling numbers to 10.

Thank you for everyone who attended Parent Evenings. It was a great opportunity to get to know one another and find out how your child is getting on.

Years 3 & 4

Years 3 & 4 have made the most of a wet and windy week.

They have been outside and collected a wide variety of seeds for their science lesson which we managed despite the weather. We have investigated whether plants have legs - how do they disperse their seeds and grow in lots of different places.

In writing this week we have studied the oldest recorded story in Britain – 'Beowulf'.

This amazing narrative has been used as a model for children to write an innovated version of the story. We have had lots of gory descriptions of the terrible battle between Beowulf and the monster Grendle.

We have been working hard on maths also with a lot of emphasis on Rockstars times tables.

Finally, it was lovely seeing people back in school after so long and great to meet new parents and old!

Years 5 & 6

Years 5 & 6 have this week continued to read our class text 'Treason', the book has been really inspiring for the children and has many links to work done within other subjects, writing and theme especially.

In writing the children have been reading a letter written by Anne Boleyn to King Henry VIII and using it to write their own persuasive letter.

Theme has been comparing Henry VIII six wives and discussing political reasons behind each of his marriages and analysing evidence provided related to the execution of Anne Boleyn.

Maths for Year 5 has been comparing and ordering 6-digit numbers and Roman Numerals, whilst Year 6 have worked on multiplying by 2 digits, and they have then moved on to division of larger numbers by one digit.

It was great to see most of our parents at Parent's Evenings this week.
